What Is Stigma?

Stigma is when someone sees you in a negative way because of your mental illness. Discrimination is when someone treats you in a negative way because of your mental illness. Social stigma and discrimination can make mental health problems worse and stop a person from getting the help they need. Avoid stigmatising people with mental illness by seeing the person first and not labelling them by their mental illness.

Stigma is defined as a sign of disgrace or discredit, which sets a person apart from others. The stigma of mental illness, although more often related to context than to a person's appearance, remains a powerful negative attribute in all social relations.

Stigma shows when someone with a mental illness is called 'dangerous', 'crazy' or 'incompetent' rather than unwell. Stigma can lead people with mental illness to be discriminated against and miss out on work or housing, bullied or to become a victim of violence. It can also mean they don't seek treatment when they need it. Why does stigma exist?

Another reason that a stigma surrounding mental health persists is the corresponding health problems that often accompany certain conditions. People don't want to have mental health issues, Dr. McLaughlin says, making it more likely they avoid it or slip into denial.

Understanding (and Getting Past) the Mental Health Stigma ...

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Stigma and discrimination can also worsen someone's mental health problems, and delay or impede their getting help and treatment, and their recovery. Social isolation, poor housing, unemployment and poverty are all linked to mental ill health. So stigma and discrimination can trap people in a cycle of illness.

Mental health-related stigma is often grounded in stereotypes that persons with mental health issues are dangerous (unpredictable, violent), responsible for their mental health issue, cannot be controlled nor recover, and should be ashamed [79].

Stigma of Mental Illness Stigma means a mark or sign of shame, disgrace or disapproval, of being shunned or rejected by others. It happens when people are embarrassed or unwilling to talk openly about their condition because they perceive it to be different or weird. Some degree of stigma is usually associated with mental illness.
